From the speeches by Pope Francis: On the Family

"The family is a community of life with its own consistency. It is not the sum of the persons by whom it is constituted, but rather a 'community of persons'", said Pope Francis, in an address to participants of the Pontifical Council for the Family taking place in Rome during these days."

"The family", continued the Pontiff, is "the place where we learn to love, the natural centre of human life". ... Each one of us builds his or her own personality within the family. ... It is there that we learn the art of dialogue and interpersonal communication". For this reason "the community-family ... asks to be recognised as such, even more nowadays, when the protection of individual rights prevails".

"The family is based on marriage. Through an act of free and faithful love, Christian couples give witness that marriage, as a sacrament, is the foundation upon which they base their family and strengthens the conjugal union and mutual self-giving"
