Going to church can help keep depression at bay research suggests.

'Research published recently in the American Journal of Epidemiology looked at different levels of social activity and how they influenced people's moods. They found that joining a religious organisation was the only activity associated with sustained happiness.

Researchers from the London Schoool of Economics and Political Science, and the Erasmus University Medical centre in the Netherlands, said it is not clear if it is faith itself that helps people, or if practising religion simply provides a sense of belonging.

Health expert, Dr Mauricio Avendano said: "The church appears to play a very important social role in keeping depression at bay and also as a coping mechanism during periods of illness in later life.'
