Together, we've helped millions of people overcome hunger, disease and disaster but sadly, there is still much work to be done. With your help, SCIAF will continue reaching out in love to the world's poorest people – and this Lent, the WEE BOX appeal will be twice as big. Every £1 SCIAF receives by 17 May will be doubled by the UK Government.

In Lent 2015, therefore, through SCIAF we will all have a unique opportunity to help twice as many poor and vulnerable communities to build a better future ... I hope the Lenten appeal will be taken to heart by each parish in the diocese. The focus this year is SCIAF's work with women farmers in Africa. Through these women, our prayers and support will also touch the lives of their husbands, children and whole village communities.'
