The Ignatian Spirituality Centre, Glasgow is launching a new nationwide retreat for Lent 2018. All the prayer materials are available (free) online to download on your phone, tablet or computer. Your local group facilitator may be able to help with printing off materials for those who do not have online access. Register on the retreat website at http://www.lentretreat.uk and then the ISC will match you with a local group which will

meet weekly throughout Lent and which will be facilitated by an experienced prayer guide or pastoral associate. Being part of one of the Lenten Prayer Groups is not essential but it is hoped that the whole experience might be deepened by appropriate sharing.

Ideally you should be able to find a time to pray with the Scripture or other material daily; anything from 15 minutes to an hour a day, whatever you find helps you. This is the first national Scottish retreat of its kind and whether you choose to pray individually or in a group you are most warmly invited to share in this retreat experience.

There will be a local group, co-ordinated by Tessa Haring. The weekly Group Meetings will be held on Wednesday evenings during Lent in the Parish House, 7.30-9pm, starting on 21 February, and ending on 28 March. A Message of Thanks from Mark Robertson of FRESH START



'A big Thank You again to those in the parishes who have very kindly kept up donations of much needed household items. Imagine being homeless and losing all of your possessions. Then you are offered the tenancy of a flat, a glimmer of hope, an opportunity to start again. But you have nothing – no pots & pans, no cutlery, no bedding, no towels – the list seems endless. This week we have been working with Thomas (name changed),

who received keys to his new flat at the beginning of the month. Thomas became homeless after his flat was set on fire. This led to him spending a long period of time in an Edinburgh Hostel. Although he was grateful to the Council for providing him with a place to stay, he described the experience as 'not much fun'. Like most of the people in his situation he needed help. We were able to help him with bedding, towels, crockery, pots and pans, toiletries and small electrical items (a toaster, kettle and an iron). At the end of the month he is going to work alongside some of our Hit Squad Volunteers and decorate his living room and bathroom. This month we are in particular need of glass tumblers, towels and clean pillows. On behalf of Fresh Start I thank you for your ongoing support.'
