

#### Information Booklet

#### Introduction

As a worshipping Catholic Community of faith and hope, we, the people of St Mary Magdalene's, including our Parish Priest, Fr. Jock Dalrymple, try to share our joy in living the Gospel of Jesus Christ by loving service of one another and the wider community. This booklet describes some of the practical ways in which we try to put these words into actions.

St Mary Magdalene's was founded in 1961 to serve the new Magdalene and Bingham housing estates which were then being built by the Local Authority. The new parish was bounded by Milton Road West on the north and the railway bridge over Duddingston Park South on the south. Because of various building problems, our church services were held in the Miners' Institute on Duddingston Park South until the church was opened in 1967. In September 2013 on the retirement of Fr Tabone from St Mary Magdalene (and also of Monsignor Rae from St. John the Evangelist in Portobello) Father Jock became parish priest of both parishes. St Mary Magdalene average Sunday Mass attendance is around 100.

#### The Sister Parishes

The parishes of St John and of St Mary Magdalene are situated about 1.5 miles apart with St John being the larger of the two. They remain separate parishes with Fr. Jock as the parish priest of both. Fr Jock lives at 3 Sandford Gardens (EH15 1LP) in what was St John's parish house but which is now the parish house for both parishes - since St Mary Magdalene's house has been sold. #### Deanery / Diocese

We are part of St Giles Deanery, which covers all the Edinburgh parishes, and of the Archdiocese of St Andrews and Edinburgh. Our bishop is Archbishop Leo Cushley, and our dean is Mgr Francis Kerr.

#### **The Pastoral Council**

St Mary Magdalene Parish Council meetings have always been open to anyone in the parish who wanted to attend. There are no elected members, but we have a Chair Person (Laura Tweedie) and a Vice Chairperson/Secretary (Jennifer Morris), chosen by election or agreement at one of the meetings. In addition we now hold two special Open Meetings each year, to which everyone is encouraged to come. These take the format of a presentation of what has happened and of future plans followed by discussion of particular items in small groups — and then a social gathering.

#### The Finance Committee

The Finance Committee has been newly formed according to diocesan guidelines. It is made up of our treasurer, Jean McInally, Jennifer Morris, Monica Gorman and Aileen Hall. It will meet regularly with Fr Jock to monitor and plan our parish finances. Contact Jennifer Morris (669 2433).

#### Awareness and Safety in our Catholic Communities.

The Roman Catholic Church in Scotland has produced guidelines for the protection of children and adults at risk. One parishioner from each of the two sister parishes is a "parish designated person" responsible for implementing these guidelines and ensuring that our parishes keep children and adults at risk as safe as possible. The parish co-ordinators are Alison Connelly (07788710897 -St Mary Magdalene's) and Peter Gillam (669 2205 -St. John's).

## Liturgical and other celebrations

#### Sunday

Our Sunday celebration of the Eucharist is at 11.15am

#### Weekday Masses

Weekday Mass is normally celebrated in the side Chapel within the church, with one morning and one evening Mass per week. However it is important to check the newsletter or website on a weekly basis for the times of these weekday Masses.

#### ●Holy Days of Obligation

On a Holy Day of Obligation Mass is normally celebrated in St. Mary Magdalene's at either 10am or 7.00pm.

#### Children's Mass

A Mass for children is celebrated once a month alternating the focus — one month on the primary 3 children preparing for the sacrament of Reconciliation and all the children; the other on the P4 children preparing for Confirmation and First Communion (through the 'Do This in Memory of Me" programme).

On Sundays when the Children's Mass is celebrated for all the children, it replaces the normal Children's Liturgy of the Word.

#### Mass of Healing

We have a Sunday Mass of healing once a year, with anointing of the sick (and elderly), at St Mary Magdalene's. There is also a monthly Mass of Healing for the 2 Parishes, held in St. John's Church, normally on the second Monday of the month at 2.30pm. This Mass is for anyone going into hospital, or for anyone who feels the need for healing whether physical, spiritual or emotional or, indeed, for anyone who just wants to come along.

#### • Sacrament of Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated in three different ways in the sister parishes:

- (a)Two times each year (during Lent and Advent) the Sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated during Sunday Mass.
- (b) At 10.30am each Saturday morning at St John's after morning Mass
- (c) Anyone can arrange to see Fr Jock at a mutually convenient time to celebrate the sacrament individually.

#### Christmas and Easter

Our Christmas celebrations normally include a Carol Service on Christmas Eve and a Christmas Day Morning Children's Mass. There are usually two Christmas Eve Vigil Masses at St John's – at 6pm (Children's) and 8.30pm. Once every four years, we hope to have a Christmas Eve Vigil Mass at St Mary Magdalene's. Information on these services will be available in the Newsletter and on the Website.

Our Easter celebrations are shared between our two parishes – taking place on Holy Thursday, Good Friday (10am Children's Stations, 3pm Solemn Liturgy and 7.30pm Stations), Holy Saturday (Vigil at 8 or 8.30pm) and Easter Sunday (9.30am and 11.15am as normal).

## Crisis Pastoral Situations

## Funeral Arrangements

When a loved one dies, individuals or families should contact Fr Jock (as well as the undertaker) to arrange a Requiem Mass or a funeral service, and burial or cremation. If Fr Jock is unavailable, contact either Pauline Connarty, the parish administrator (669 5447) or Jennifer Morris, the St Mary Magdalene's representative on the parish team (669 2433).

## Pastoral Care and the Hospital

The name of any Catholic being admitted to hospital should be given to Ann Aitchison (242 1990), the Royal Infirmary chaplaincy team secretary. She will arrange for the person to receive pastoral care. Fr Jock should also be informed. If a person would like to receive the anointing of the sick before entering hospital, please contact Fr Jock (669 5447). If admitted to hospital in an emergency there will be an on-call priest that the hospital chaplain will be able to contact.

## Pastoral Emergency in the Parish

If you cannot contact Fr Jock (669 5447) in a pastoral emergency, please contact Pauline Connarty, parish administrator (669 5447), or any member of the pastoral team.

## Protection of Children or Adults at Risk

If you have any concerns please voice them to our parish protection coordinator Alison Connelly (07788710897) or Peter Gillam (669 2205).

## Sacramental Preparation and Celebration

#### RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

For anyone not a Catholic, but interested in knowing more about the Catholic faith, and perhaps being baptised or received and confirmed at the Easter Vigil, we have an RCIA programme which serves both parishes and begins each September. The group normally meets every Tuesday at the parish house. It sometimes includes a number of returning Catholics who want to update on their faith to help them reintegrate into the parish. #### RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation for Children)

#### **Baptism**

Parents meet with Father Jock before undertaking a two session course of preparation with the sister parishes' Baptismal team. After the course and before the baptism, Father Jock visits the family in their home. Baptisms are celebrated, either during Sunday Mass or by arrangement at another time. However, baptisms are not usually celebrated during the seasons of Lent and Advent. For more details please contact Father Jock (669 5447) or Kath Zoltie (07799251524).

#### Reconciliation, confirmation and first communion:

In P3 the children and their parents undertake a course of preparation before celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Then in P4 they prepare for the children to receive the Sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Communion by following the "Do This in Memory of me" programme which includes a monthly parish mass. Part of the preparation normally takes place in collaboration with or local parish primary school of St John's. If your child is not in a Catholic school and you would like them to receive these sacraments please contact Father Jock (669 5447) or our coordinator for sacramental preparation, Alison Connolly (07788710897)

#### MARRIAGE

If you wish to be married in a Catholic Church, six months' notice is required as well as participation in a preparation course. The couple normally register with Father Jock and attend a preparation course run by the Diocese. Following this they continue their preparation with Father Jock during two meetings in which they complete the pre-nuptial enquiry forms, plan their wedding service and discuss relevant matters with the aid of some questionnaires. A rehearsal takes place during the days before the wedding. Contact Father Jock – 669 5447

#### Children's Liturgy of the Word.

A team of catechists prepare and lead the Liturgy of the Word for children every Sunday except when there is a Children's Mass for all the children. Contact Una Gallagher (657 2831).

#### Altar Servers

Boys and girls in P3 and above are invited to join as servers for the Sunday Eucharist and other major celebrations. We also have a few adult servers. Contact Sam Henry(669 3070)

#### Communion Ministers

A number of people are commissioned to assist in this ministry.

There are two ways in which the ministry is exercised.

- (a) The first is assisting with the distribution of communion at Mass
- (b) The second is taking communion to the sick and housebound. This offers anyone who is unable to come to church, the opportunity of being linked to the community by receiving Holy Communion in their own home or in one of the care homes in the area.

#### Sunday Teas and Coffees

Every Sunday after Mass everybody is invited to the hall for tea, coffee and biscuits. This allows us to continue our Sunday celebration of the Eucharist. Two people each week prepare and serve the refreshments. The rota is organised by Carolynne McCann ( 669 6165 ) and Jennifer Morris (669 2433)

#### Church Cleaners

A small group forms a team for the regular cleaning of the church. An invitation is normally issued to the parish when more helpers are required - "Many hands make light work"....



No 4 bus from City Centre to The Jewel passes the Church door.

No 21 bus

No 49 bus

Nos 21 and 49 also pass St John's Church on Brighton Place
