## **EDDIE WHITE'S ORDINATION TO THE DIACONATE – SATURDAY 7 SEPTEMBER**

**Eddie writes:** 'It is now less than two weeks until I will be ordained a Permanent Deacon. The ordination – celebrated by Archbishop Cushley - will be held in the Cathedral on Saturday 7 September at noon. Having spent the last four years in our two parishes in formation for the diaconate, I would very much like to invite you to join me at the Cathedral in less than two weeks time in order that it be a joint parish celebration.

We would be very grateful if those who cannot attend could please keep Tanya, myself and our three children - Fergus, Benedict and Eloise - in your prayers on the day.

Deacons serve the Church in Ministries of Word, Altar and Charity. This means a deacon proclaims the gospel at Mass, can preach at Mass and can conduct baptisms, funerals and weddings. However, for deacons, the most important ministry is that of charity – for example, seeking to minister to the sick or to those affected by addiction or treated unfairly.

It would be wonderful to see the Cathedral full of St John's and St Mary Magdalene's parishioners.'

**The Cluster Group D Day Landings Battlefields Pilgrimage 2019** sets off this Sunday morning from St Ninian's at 10am, and returns on Friday...please pray for the 40 pilgrims, most of them from our five cluster parishes.

### **A Pilgrimage – Why?**

Des Brogan reflects: 'On Sunday 25 August parishioners and friends from the eastern parishes in the city of Edinburgh will begin a six day pilgrimage to the battlefields of Normandy, France, where the D Day landings took place 75 years ago on 6 June 1944. Why is this a pilgrimage? According to the dictionary 'a pilgrimage is a journey or search of moral or spiritual significance. Typically, it is a journey to a shrine or other location of importance to a person's beliefs and faith, although sometimes it can be a metaphorical journey into someone's own beliefs.' Certainly those who have already visited the Commonwealth War Graves Commission cemeteries will testify to the powerful impact of these Silent Cities. But do visits to such places constitute a 'pilgrimage'?

As Christians we are called to reflect on important issues and make up our own minds. Once we have done this we can act upon our decisions. Visiting the beaches of D Day, hearing the accounts of those involved in battle on both sides, standing beside the graves of young men who fought and died for what they believed to be right cannot but challenge us to reflect on war and its causes and consequences. Such visits demand that we learn more about what happened, and encourage us to consider rights and wrongs. We learn that truth is often more nuanced than what we originally thought and compels us to make that journey into our own beliefs.

Compassion, forgiveness, reconciliation and hope are central to the practice of our Christian faith. Any time spent visiting Normandy battlefields cannot but engage these virtues and encourage us to reflect on what we can do individually to make our world a more peaceful place centered on Christian values. We remember those who died, we pray for their families and our world.

If such a journey is not pilgrimage then I do not know what is.'
