ST JOHN'S CHURCH – LIGHTING REPLACEMENT

Chris Vinestock and the St John's Fabric Team write: 'Work will commence on Tuesday 5 February on the long planned renovation of our lighting - and will continue over a period of approximately 12 weeks. We are all extremely grateful for a wonderfully generous donation from a parishioner which will cover almost all the costs and allow work to begin much sooner than anticipated.'

During this time the church will be closed from Monday to Friday each week, reopening Saturdays and Sundays for Mass at the normal times.

Our Major Winter Initiative - Sunday 10 February (and 24 Feb, 10 and 24 March) – A **Pastoral Care Course - Four Evenings for Pastoral Visitors**, a course run by the Ignatian Study Centre, Glasgow for all the PACT Churches - at Portobello and Joppa Parish Church – 7-9pm.

Catriona Fletcher and Fr David Birchell SJ of the ISC write: 'The course is aimed at those people who are based in the churches of Portobello, Duddingston, Magdalene and Bingham who are involved in visiting and pastoral care. We shall be looking at ways of making our pastoral care more effective and deeper spiritually. Four Sunday evenings, 7pm – 9pm....Topics will include: *Our Personal Faith Journey, Listening Skills, Supporting Contemporary Families, Scriptural/Theological Basis for Pastoral Care, Being comfortable with Spiritual Conversations and Praying with others.*'

Fr Jock writes: 'It's so good a week on from the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity to introduce this course where Episcopalians, Baptists, Catholics and Presbyterians will be gathering together to help develop our pastoral care in the community. The course is open to all – though please let me know if you plan to come – but a particular invitation is offered to those involved in pastoral care in our parishes and community – the St Vincent de Paul, The Legion of Mary, Eucharistic Ministers taking communion to the housebound and the Pastoral Team. And it's free....thanks to a generous subsidy from the Adelphi Trust.'

The next Baptismal Preparation Course will take place at 7.30pm in the Parish House on Wednesday 27 February and Wednesday 13 March.
