## **Ecumenism – and how!**

The Dutch government are seeking to expel a family of Armenian refugees, political activists who had fled to the Netherlands nine years previously. However, the Dutch police are not allowed to remove someone from a church while a service is going on so the family have been sheltering in the Bethel Church in The Hague since 26 October while a continuous service has been taking place! Ecumenism has not been strong in the Netherlands but has been given a boost by the clergy of all denominations taking their turn in this marathon – the Protestant Church of the Netherlands, Pentecostals, Baptists, Reformed Orthodox and Catholic clergy have all been involved. The Bethel Church has asked people to pray for the family and for 400 other children affected by the strict Dutch policies, and, if you are in the vicinity, pay a visit - visitors are needed to ensure that the church service and asylum can continue.
