<u>A warm welcome to Fr Loreto Tabone</u> who arrived last Sunday bringing good weather with him - at least initially!- and will be with us until Wednesday when he returns to Gozo. Please keep **Fr Jock** in your prayers while he is on retreat, staying with the L'Arche community in the village of Trosly-Breuil where Jean Vanier, the founder of L'Arche, lives.

This Sunday at 2.30pm in St John's Church, **there is a special SCIAF Stations of the Cross** followed by tea/coffee and the chance to meet **2 visitors from Ethiopia - Huka and Tsegye**. This special event has been organised as part of the SCIAF WEE BOX campaign which focuses on South Ethiopia this year. All welcome. Admission free.

Next Sunday there will be a **Special Collection for Papal & Episcopal Charities** (**75% of the collection goes to SCIAF**, the remaining 25% to the diocesan Care Fund, supporting charities in our own archdiocese).

Next Sunday is also our '**Reconciliation Sunday**' when several priests will be available to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation at the start of Mass. With this newsletter there is **an Examination of Conscience/Consciousness to help us all prepare for Holy Week and Easter.** Archbishop Leo is inviting each one of us to 'Rediscover Confession this Lent'. Please pick up one of his cards which can be found at the back of each church.

24 Hours for the Lord: 7.30pm Friday 4th March – 6pm (Vigil Mass) Saturday 5th March: St Mary's Cathedral: Archbishop Leo writes: 'This was initiated by Pope Francis last year and in this Jubilee Year of Mercy, he wants it to take place all over the world. It consists of 24 hours of Eucharistic Adoration with the sacrament of reconciliation available throughout for anyone who wishes.'

A Pastoral visit from Archbishop Leo Cushley – Saturday & Sunday 12th/13th March

A reminder that Archbishop Leo will be joining us for our three weekend Masses on the 5th Sunday of Lent, and **will present diocesan medals to Kathy Gallagher and Bernard Ayres**. On that Sunday, Mass at St Mary Magdalene's will be at <u>11.30am</u>, not 11.15am, which will allow the Archbishop the opportunity to meet St John's parishioners after the 9.30am Mass.

The most important time in our Christian calendar is that Holy Week, from Palm Sunday (20th March) to Easter Sunday (27th March). Please continue to pray for our three catechumens and our candidate who will be baptised and/or confirmed at the Easter Vigil - Christopher Umwani, David Wylie and Gary Zoltie, and Freddie MacLennan Hawkes; and do mark that week in your diary/on your calendar.

As we continue our Lenten journey a reminder that there are a variety of options on offer for parishioners to explore different paths to prayer. Details of services, including Masses, Devotions, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Stations of the Cross and Morning Prayer can be found on the back of the newsletter. Or if you would like to join a Lenten house group — and it's not too late to do so - please choose from the list at the back of the churches and contact the host.

Spiritual Nourishment - each week we offer a free leaflet with a short scriptural phrase from the daily readings to 'chew on' during the day, and **Wednesday Word** (to be found in both church porches), with the Sunday readings for the following weekend, and a short and informative commentary on them.

'Sponsored Slim'... an opportunity to support a project in Rwanda by sponsoring Fr Jock to lose a few pounds! Sponsor sheets can be found at the back of both churches. Fr Jock writes: 'One of the people I find most inspiring in life is an 82 year old Irish nun, Sr Margaret Mary, a Canoness of St Augustine, who lives in rural Rwanda in a new convent with several young Rwandan nuns and novices. As well as providing a contemplative presence in a country still trying to rebuild after the genocide, they are expanding their Pastoral Centre to offer a place of healing and prayer.' Sr Margaret Mary would like to install a water tank to collect rain water for washing and cleaning and they are also in the process of furnishing a new oratory for those who come for healing and to pray.

Legion of Mary - An invitation to possible new members.

Maria Igoe writes: 'There has been a group of the Legion of Mary in St John's parish for over 35 years, but we realise that many people do not know very much, if anything, about the Legion, even although it is the largest apostolic organisation in the Church with 4 million members in 170 countries. The object of the Legion is the Glory of God through the holiness of the members. We are all called to be saints and as members of the Legion, we are following Jesus' command 'to be holy'. That does not mean we see ourselves better than anyone else, but that our aim is to have a close relationship with Jesus Christ, through Prayer, Mass and the Sacraments.

It may surprise some to learn that the patron of the Legion is the Holy Spirit. The Legion colour is red. Our Lady was the first Apostle and she is our model. We, the members, were asked to join the Legion, and we said, "Yes". Our

Lady said "Yes" when she was asked to be the mother of God. We are the 'Yes people'. We have a weekly meeting in the parish house, when we pray together and discuss our work. Among the works done by the Legion is evangelization in all its forms, and this can be very exciting. We are always looking for new ways to bring the 'Good News' to the world. This leads us to other countries, eg Finland, and to the north of India, as well as every part of Britain. We have been asked to go to Lapland this year, where no missionaries have been before.

Of course other works are done, such as visiting the sick and housebound, bereaved and lonely, and any other works at the request of the Parish Priest. We work with the Missionaries of Charity (Mother Theresa's order) and have recently started an outreach to those begging in Princes Street. Not everyone is expected to do really difficult work. It can take years for a member to be able to take on the most challenging works. Over the years we have had sufficient members for our work, both young and old, men and women. However, as some members are now 'elderly', it is essential that we try to get some younger members. Age is not a barrier and the Legion is for all Baptised and Confirmed Catholics. Please do not be put off by thinking, "I could not do that". Believe that the Holy Spirit will help you to do great things for the faith we love. So we invite you to 'come and see'.
