An update from Sr Margaret Mary in Rwanda — (on the Pastoral Centre for which we sent funds from the Martin Aelred Concert, the St John's Spring Fayre, a Monday morning coffee morning, a significant birthday and the sponsored slim!):\_ Builders fall behind schedule there too... '...sadly, the fact is that all is not yet in order. We were promised the building at the end of April; we have not yet received it but are able to use it for big groups. The difficult part is that after each group we have to remove all the bedding to allow the workmen to continue painting (3rd coat it seems) varnishing and other small jobs. One advantage of being able to use it before it is handed over is that some defects to plumbing and with doors, have come to light, so all will be fixed before the final date which we HOPE will be at the end of this month. The oratory is not yet in use but we have a lovely little tabernacle and an altar we like very much. I hope to be able to send you a photo when all is in place. The date foreseen for the inauguration and blessing is 11 September when Sr.Colette, our Prioress General, will be here. One very good piece of news is that we hope that the present generator will all the same be sufficient to aliment the new building also with a few additions and of course cables. I think the gift may cover the lot. The installation has still to be done.'
