LENT starts on Ash Wednesday – 1 March – this Wednesday

It is, with Good Friday, one of only two days of Fasting and Abstinence in the Church's Year.

There will be Mass with Distribution of Ashes at 9.45am at St Mary Magdalene's (with St John's Primary school) and at 7.30pm at St John's.

This Week, there are three other important services to which everybody is invited

- On Monday at 2.30pm at St John's the monthly Mass of Healing with the sacrament of the sick. It will be preceded by the rosary, and followed by an opportunity for reconciliation, and tea and coffee and pre-Lenten cakes (!) in the Hall.
- On Friday at 6.30pm at Portobello and Joppa Church the (originally Women's but now for everbody) World Day of Prayer - All welcome

Jennifer Morris writes: "The aim is to read the New Testament over 8 weeks. RUNNING FOR PEACE....IN TANZANIA!

Mike Knox writes: 'There are 12 young people from Legho running for Peace in the Kilimanjaro Marathon on Sunday this weekend. They are asking family and friends to sponsor them. Any money they raise they will use to set up a fund for orphans, of which there are over 16,000 in the Diocese of Moshi. The Christmas Gift Collection was for young people in Legho this year

The young people set up a Makutano Group in Legho and have just completed a week's ICT basic training. This was funded from the Christmas Gift Collection. The money donated will cover the small £3 entry fee for the marathon and the bus fare to get to town, which they simply do not have.

I also gave Fr Sangawe £50 which he used to put on a Christmas Mass and Party for all the Legho Primary children. There is still half the collection left, which they will use to set up a chicken project and a sewing project, the latter using the machines that were provided by Pamoja Fashion. They have decided that the profits will also go to their Orphans Fund. They will run together with the Mweka Makutano Group and will take part in a joint retreat in March, the Legho Groups expenses also being covered from the collection.
