Fr Jock writes: 'As quite a lot of parishioners from both parishes are aware, in October last year, long before my mother's death, I made provisional plans - since Lent didn't start till 1 March – to take a month away from the parishes in order to work on the book on my priest uncle Jock that a friend, Bernadette Campbell, and I had been working on for over ten years! Since arriving in late November 2013, I have not managed to find any time to work on it – all half a million words of it (so hard to cut one's own work...but so necessary, as is honing) so this seemed the only way to make any progress (and absolutely no guarantees that it will be finished, or near finished, at the end of February – so limited expectations please!)

Fr Tabone very generously agreed to come over from Gozo from four weeks from 25 January to 23 February to make this time away possible. I am, as so often, immensely grateful to him. It's lovely to see the smile that always comes to people's faces when his name (and, sometimes, imminent arrival) is mentioned.

However, after the events of the last few weeks – and so many thanks to the many kind people who came to the funeral last Monday and to all who have been praying for my mother and us all and offering such loving support – my plans have had to change a little. I will still be away from the parishes for most of the month, although popping in occasionally (hopefully briefly!), and working on the book, but will be spending most of the time nearby in or near North Berwick to keep an eye on my father, and to do the kind of things that need to be done in the aftermath of the death and funeral of a parent. Again, your prayers and understanding during these weeks will be greatly appreciated.'
