A PILGRIMAGE TO ASSISI - 26 August-6 September 2018

Revd Tom Cuthell writes: 'For the past 27 years I, the Rev Tom Cuthell, formerly Minister of St Cuthbert's Parish Church at the West End, have led group pilgrimages to Assisi. In 2016, Fr Jock and I led a hugely successful ecumenical pilgrimage to Assisi. In so many different ways Catholic and Protestant shared a remarkable unity in Christ, and the sense of togetherness in the group was so tangible. This year - 2017 - two parishioners of St John's, Maureen Brogan and Jeremy Devlin-Thorp, were part of the group, and I think it would be true to say that their time in Assisi certainly lived up to their expectations, and perhaps may have surpassed them.

Assisi is truly a holy and blessed place where the veil between time and eternity is as thin as gossamer. The possibility of being ambushed by grace is very real. Few people spend time in Assisi without catching something of the spirit of St Francis, and without being infected, even in a very small degree by his love of God and his love of God's world. A key factor in the success of these holiday pilgrimages is where we live. The Sisters of Santa Brigida can only be described as 'angels of hospitality'. They lavish love and care on us in abundant measure. The food they serve is excellent. But what appeals most is the feeling that we have been welcomed into their home as honoured guests - so much so that we feel part of their family.

I have been planning Assisi 2018 for some time, **and there are still a few places available**. The dates are 26th August to 6th September. It would be good if there was, again, an ecumenical dimension to the group - in other words, parishioners of St John's and St Mary Magdalene's signing up! I would be delighted to welcome you on board and have the opportunity of introducing you to 'the Assisi experience'. Why not have a chat with those who in 2016 and 2017 were captivated by 'the Assisi experience' - if only to whet your appetite?


