The Theme of the lunchtime prayer meetings this year is 'Only Justice'.

Bob Fyffe, General Secretary, Churches Together in Britain and Ireland writes: 'Last year we were invited to reflect upon the continuing impact of the Transatlantic Slave Trade upon Caribbean society and upon Christian unity and witness. This year we are reminded again that our prayer for unity is offered up amidst injustice and that Christian disunity is in so many ways related to the divisions in our world.'

The Churches of Indonesia, from whom the material comes, speak out of a context of ethnic and religious diversity, and where there is a strong emphasis upon the need for a unity that is found in diversity, and one built on solidarity and collaboration. Yet they also highlight issues of economic injustice and how religious pluralism can face challenges in the face of radicalization.

This gives us an opportunity to reflect upon the context in which we pray for Christian unity. How do divisions in our society contribute to divisions in the Church? How does injustice in our British and Irish contexts create challenges in pursuit of our shared life together?’

NOTICEBOARD

THE VISIT OF BRUCE KENT TO SCOTLAND:

Jim Roarty of the Justice and Peace Group writes: ‘For those of a particular age, Bruce Kent needs no introduction. Born in London in 1929 and educated by the Jesuits at Stonyhurst, he had a spell in the army before being ordained in 1958. His first experience of CND was not a happy one when one of its marches through London caused several brides to be late for their weddings at the Kensington church where he was a curate!

It was while he was chaplain to the University of London that he became convinced of the evil of nuclear weapons and became active in the Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament. In the 60’s, this was a high profile campaign with large numbers of supporters, but also large numbers of opponents, with CND leaders such as Fr Bruce Kent being vilified as traitors to their country.

In the 70’s, as the focus switched to other things – Vietnam, economic woes etc – the CND’s numbers dropped away. However, in 1979, the then Mgr Bruce Kent – still a priest – took up the reins just as concern was rising about Cruise missiles being based in the UK and discussions starting about Trident as a replacement for Polaris; membership took off from almost zero to over 100,000, huge demonstrations were held across the country and Mgr Kent’s face was seldom off our screens. MI5 tapped his phone, he was accused of being a Communist subversive and someone sent him a parcel bomb – so he must have been doing something right!

In 1987, because Canon Law forbade him as a priest to actively campaign during the General Election, he resigned the priesthood. The following year, he married Valerie, a fellow peace worker.

Bruce has been active in other causes; among other things, he chaired War on Want and is active in assisting prisoners of conscience. However, it is his role as a leader in the campaign against nuclear weapons that he is best known, a role which he fulfils with charm and an active sense of humour but also with a commitment and determination still undimmed even as he approaches his 90th birthday.’

Neill Walker writes: ‘In a secular age where many feel alienated from religion, and most structures are melting, hope lies in wisdom. But where are the springs of wisdom today? We rediscover them in a new vision of reality born in contemplative silence - and also in art, in working for peace and justice and in dialogue that heals divisions. With his global knowledge of contemplative community and dialogue with secular society, Fr. Laurence exposes new and old sources of wisdom to show how to live hopefully and reconnect with the traditions on which our future depends. Laurence Freeman OSB is a Benedictine monk and the spiritual guide and Director of The World Community for Christian Meditation, an ecumenical contemplative community. Before entering monastic life Laurence Freeman had experience with the United Nations, in banking and in journalism. An international speaker and retreat leader he is the author of many articles and books including, *The Selfless Self*, *Jesus: The Teacher Within*, *First Sight: The Experience of Faith and Beauty’s Field*. Fr Freeman has conducted dialogues and peace initiatives such as the historic “Way of Peace” with the Dalai Lama, and is active in inter-religious dialogue with leaders of other faiths. He was awarded the Order of Canada in recognition of his work for dialogue and the promotion of world peace. He is the Director of Meditatio, the outreach program of the community, which engages with the secular world on the themes of Education, Mental Health, Business, Addiction and Recovery, Interfaith, and the Environment. He has been teaching an MBA course on Meditation and Leadership, at the McDonough School of Business at Georgetown University, Washington DC, since 2013, as well as the course on Health & Meditation: Healing From the Centre, at the Royal College of Physicians Ireland. Through The World Community for Christian Meditation community Laurence Freeman continues the work of teaching Christian Meditation and restoring the contemplative as the essential and central dimension of all Christian spirituality.
