A warm welcome and our thanks to Fr Jim Smith, helping before all our Masses this Sunday, and Fr Martin Moran OMI with us before the 9.30am, as those who would celebrate a socially distanced Reconciliation. Reconciliation will also be celebrated next Saturday at 6.30pm before Mass begins....

- after the 10am Mass this Thursday 17 December at St Mary Magdalene's,
- and from 5.15 to 6.15pm next Sunday 20 December in St John's.

Next Saturday morning, at 10am at St John's, there will be an extra Mass, which will include the baptisms of **Alasdair Preston** and **Jayden O'Hara**, the reception into the Catholic Church of **Jessica Mzambe**, and the confirmation and first communion of all three of them – as we continue with the RCIA celebrations that were postponed at Easter. We are continuing to livestream some of our Weekday Masses from the Prayer Room in the Parish House - this week on Monday and Friday at 10am and Tuesday at 7.00pm (This is partly because after every Mass in one of our Churches, 'deep cleaning' has to take place – something that takes a considerable length of time and effort. We are so incredibly grateful to our welcomers, stewards and cleaners who are making it possible for us to have our churches open – and always open to new volunteers.)

Please also be aware that you will need to utilize hand sanitisers as you come into and leave the church, and masks <u>must</u> be worn throughout the service.

Due to the COVID regulations we have limited seatings available and therefore **we advise early booking**. We are grateful for your patience and understanding in these difficult times.'

**Fr Jock writes:** 'It is obviously going to be a rather different Christmas to any other so we ask your patience and understanding as we try to organise the Masses in the best and fairest way possible – in terms of numbers, venues, times and how people book and places are allocated.

Due to Covid restrictions, and despite holding four Christmas Masses, there will not be enough spaces for all who wish to attend....It has finally been decided that for the services at 8.30pm on Christmas Eve and 9.30am and 11.15am on Christmas Day, the names of attendees will be chosen by 'drawing names from a hat'.

So if you wish to attend one of these three Christmas Masses please contact the Parish House – by calling 669 5618 or emailing *stjohnsandstmarymagdalenes@gmail.com* between last Tuesday and this coming Wednesday (16 December) and your name will be put into the draw.

To ensure that singles as well as groups can attend there will be separate draws for each category.

Those who do not get a space will be given priority for the Masses of 26 and 27 December – The Feast of the Holy Family.

- b) the service you wish to attend (please limit to one service only)
- c) whether the application is for one person or for a group that can sit together;
- d) if a group, the number of people;
- e) which Mass on 26 (6.30pm) or 27 December (9.30am, 11.15am and 4.30pm) you would wish to attend if you don't get a space for Christmas Eve or Christmas Day;

When spaces have been allocated, you will be contacted to let you know whether or not you have a space, and if you do, for which Mass.

For the Christmas Eve 5.30pm Children and Family Bubble Mass (for children and family bubbles only) bookings should be made by calling or texting Arlene Lauder on 07950 880833 between 8 and 16 December. After that you will be informed if you have a place – and if not, you will be given a first option for the two Children's Masses on 10 January.

We will also do our best to livestream as many of the Christmas Masses as we can, so everybody has a chance to participate in Mass on Christmas Eve/Day.

PS For those wary of the idea of 'drawing from a hat', it does have scriptural basis: in the Acts of the Apostles (Chapter 1 verse 26), the Apostles are choosing who to fill the gap left by Judas' death, and two names are put forward, Joseph and Barsabbas...the apostles then pray – 'they then drew lots for them, and as the lot fell to Matthias, he was listed as one of the twelve apostles....'!

## HOW ARE WE GOING TO KEEP WARM IN OUR CHURCHES THIS WINTER?



Both of our churches have circulating warm air central heating systems.

Current Government regulations recommend that the system can be used provided we switch it off 30 minutes before people arrive at the Church.

In practice that means one hour before Mass as our welcomers, organist and audio-visual team are in attendance earlier.

It is our intention to purchase additional electric heaters in order to endeavour to keep the churches as comfortable as possible.

We encourage everyone to dress as warmly as they can and perhaps bring their own knee blanket ... remembering to take it home again!

# GOOD NEWS OF GREAT JOY.... WELL, AT LEAST GOOD NEWS OF A LOAN FROM THE DIOCESE FOR THE ST JOHN'S TOWER PROJECT:

Gary Zoltie, Chair of St John's Finance Council, writes: 'Firstly, some good news!! At a meeting of the Trustees of the Archdiocese on Thursday 26 November they approved our proposal for an increased loan of £150,000 which now means that we have the funds in place to push on with the full tower renovation. The loan will be interest free and repaid over a maximum period of 25 years. Any money raised through donations, second collections, fundraising and grants will contribute towards reducing the loan required and the time over which the loan is repaid. Following my talk after the two St John's Masses a couple of weekends ago, we have received some questions from parishioners about how to process donations and standing order payments so we thought it would be worthwhile to restate that here:-



# 'WHERE I FIND GOD' - Daniel O'Connell

Last thing at night, before I go to bed, I call into the children's bedrooms. We have two boys: one is five and the other is seven. I love this final visit. They are always fast asleep, tucked up safe and sound. They are so peaceful and perfect at this time. In these visits, I feel such a sense of well-being and my heart swells. There is a profound sense of connection to them; my life bound up with theirs.

In these visits I forget about the day that has gone by and I don't think about the one to come; all I know is this moment. Here I am forgetful of myself. I feel free, simply enveloped in love for these two boys. And it is here, in these moments, that I find God.

I believe that God is love and where there is love, there is God. My children help me notice and cherish the presence of love. In this way, I believe they are somewhat sacramental; their lives reveal the presence of God. Their very existence reorientates my whole life and invites me into love. They ask me to join them in the present moment, for example to wrestle with them on the floor and find delight in doing it. When we explore together the world of Power Rangers, they are asking me to let go of my busyness and take myself less seriously. They help me into a world in which I become less attached to myself and more open to them and their world of wonder and possibility. I believe their love helps me notice God – who is love – loving me, in and through my children.
