Fr Jock writes: 'It is obviously going to be a rather different Christmas to any other so we ask your patience and understanding as we try to organise the Masses in the best and fairest way possible – in terms of numbers, venues, times and how people book and places are allocated.

Due to Covid restrictions, and despite holding four Christmas Masses, there will not be enough spaces for all who wish to attend....It has finally been decided that for the services at 8.30pm on Christmas Eve and 9.30am and 11.15am on Christmas Day, the names of attendees will be chosen by 'drawing names from a hat'.

So if you wish to attend one of these three Christmas Masses please contact the Parish House – by calling 669 5618 or emailing *stjohnsandstmarymagdalenes@gmail.com* between Tuesday 8 and Wednesday 16 December and your name will be put into the draw.

To ensure that singles as well as groups can attend there will be separate draws for each category.

Those who do not get a space will be given priority for the Masses of 26 and 27 December – The Feast of the Holy Family.

- b) the service you wish to attend (please limit to one service only)
- c) whether the application is for one person or for a group that can sit together;
- d) if a group, the number of people;
- e) which Mass on 26 (6.30pm) or 27 December (9.30am, 11.15am and 4.30pm) you would wish to attend if you don't get a space for Christmas Eve or Christmas Day;

When spaces have been allocated, you will be contacted to let you know whether or not you have a space, and if you do, for which Mass.

For the Christmas Eve 5.30pm Children and Family Bubble Mass (for children and family bubbles only) bookings should be made by calling or texting Arlene Lauder on 07950 880833 between 8 and 16 December. After that you will be informed if you have a place – and if not, you will be given a first option for the two Children's Masses on 10 January.

We will also do our best to livestream as many of the Christmas Masses as we can, so everybody has a chance to participate in Mass on Christmas Eve/Day.

PS For those wary of the idea of 'drawing from a hat', it does have scriptural basis: in the Acts of the Apostles (Chapter 1 verse 26), the Apostles are choosing who to fill the gap left by Judas' death, and two names are put forward, Joseph and Barsabbas...the apostles then pray – 'they then drew lots for them, and as the lot fell to Matthias, he was listed as one of the twelve apostles....'!

An Advent Journey with the Scottish Laity Network Forced like Jesus Christ to Flee - How shall we Sing to the Lord in a Foreign Land?

Thursday 10 December – Danny Sweeney - Forced to Leave ~ No Room in a Foreign Land

Danny was a Civil Servant working in Yorkshire for the Home Office Asylum Directorate. The same day he interviewed with <u>Justice and Peace Scotland</u> for a job was the day that the 'old jungle' camp in Calais was destroyed. Danny's work and life in Scotland has kept treading a path through Calais, and walking alongside refugees and asylum seekers, seeing the frontline of a humanitarian crisis unfolding in our society.

Thursday 17 December ~ Hyab Yohannes and Hannah Rose Thomas - Stories of Pain, Survival and Hope leading to a Liturgy of Lament and Hope

Hyab is an Eritrean refugee and researcher at the University of Glasgow and holder of the UNESCO RILA PhD Scholarship. He works formally for local charities and international organisations in Egypt including UNHCR, IOM, Africa and Middle East Refugee Assistance (AMERA) and Saint Andrew's Refugee Services (StARS).

Hannah is an English artist and Durham graduate in Arabic and History, currently studying her PhD at Glasgow University as a UNESCO Scholar. While living in Jordan as an Arabic student in 2014, Hannah organised art projects with Syrian refugees for UNHCR. This experience led her to seek ways to combine her art and humanitarian work. Hannah subsequently began painting portraits of refugees she had met, to show the people behind the global crisis, whose personal stories are often shrouded by statistics

Through her art Hannah gives voice to the voiceless, lionises the isolated and prescribes dignity to the persecuted and forcibly displaced. Hannah seeks to use art as a tool for advocacy, bringing their stories into places of influence in the West.

GOOD NEWS OF GREAT JOY.... WELL, AT LEAST GOOD NEWS OF A LOAN FROM THE DIOCESE FOR THE ST JOHN'S TOWER PROJECT:

Gary Zoltie, Chair of St John's Finance Council, writes: 'Firstly, some good news!! At a meeting of the Trustees of the Archdiocese on Thursday 26 November they approved our proposal for an increased loan of £150,000 which now means that we have the funds in place to push on with the full tower renovation. The loan will be interest free and repaid over a maximum period of 25 years. Any money raised through donations, second collections, fundraising and grants will contribute towards reducing the loan required and the time over which the loan is repaid.





'WHERE I FIND GOD' - Rita O'Brien

Rita O'Brien is married to a farmer and lives in the countryside. She is the mother of two boys, Tom and Conor. She has mostly worked as a midwife and neonatal nurse, but more recently changed career to be eavement counsellor in the Maternity Hospital



One day a woman came into the hospital where I work for her routine ultrasound scan of her baby at thirty-six weeks' gestation. The baby's heartbeat had stopped. The doctor told her gently that her baby had died. I sat in silence with this lady. When she lifted her head, we held each other's gaze for what seemed like an eternity. I felt God in that gaze.

When I worked in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, sometimes out of the blue I was touched by a wave of calm and I could feel God between my hands and the baby's tiny body.

On Sunday, tucked away in our little Godly playroom overhead, the congregation below, I sit on the floor in a circle with the children and in silence we "get ready" to hear the story. Those precious moments recharge my batteries for the whole week.

I know deep down, even though I am not always aware or tuned in, that every one of us and all of creation are connected by this great Mystery that we call God.

Episode Four: "The Rock on which it was built".

With his life and family under threat from Rome, Simon (Peter) spends one last night fishing in a desperate attempt to square his debts. Andrew spots a familiar face waiting for them on the shores of Lake Galilee...

Matthew is described by Simon as 'a little off.' He watches the night fishing trip from the hilltop with his dog and witnesses the morning catch.

- a) Simon, as portrayed in this series, at this stage of his life, is losing everything. Is this the kind of person I imagined Jesus chose on which to build his church? Simon's ear has been cut by the Romans, mirroring, perhaps, the source of his outburst in the garden of Gethsemane...
- b) We meet Simon's wife (Eden) and her Eema/Ima (Mum). We are invited to consider Simon with real life modern issues can/should Granny come to live with us? How are we going to manage financially? How can considering Simon's situation influence me today?
