Jim Roarty writes: 'Bethany recently sent out a very long message about the current set-up for the night shelter now in the Old Waverley Hotel (to enable single room accommodation for the guests) and the extension of the night shelter season to 29 June (originally 3 May). Here are the key points

- o the additional nights mean more volunteers to cook and/or serve the meals. (Note: because of an insurance issue, we can't use the kitchens at the hotel so the cooking has to be done at the Diadem at Gorgie and the food conveyed in to the Old Waverley.). We have volunteered to do 3 more nights based on the responses received from you but if anyone else would like to put their name forward, let me know. PPE (masks and gloves) available at both locations.
- o Can anyone suggest any restaurants which could help with the catering?
- Some teams are willing to cook but need funded for the food. The J&P group can
 provide some assistance with this and we have been offered a donation from a parishioner, but if you
 wish to make a donation, please let me know.
- o To help keep guests entertained during lockdown, Bethany are looking for donations of foreign language novels (already have a good supply of English ones), single-person board games, a guitar, jigsaws, puzzle books, art supplies. If you have any, again let me know and we can arrange a pick-up
- O Volunteers are needed to help with housekeeping on a Saturday or Sunday. As alternative accommodation is found for guests, the rooms they have been staying in need cleaned but the hotel staff don't work weekends so if anyone could spare a couple of hours on a Saturday or Sunday to get rooms ready for new guests, that would be helpful.

• The final request from Bethany is "Lastly, if you can please pray that all the above needs will be provided for, that we can give the best support needed to our guests and also for the wellbeing of our guests, staff and volunteers."

Pope Francis celebrated Thursday morning Mass, the Fourth Week of Easter, at the Casa Santa Marta with special prayers for artists and an invitation to Christians never to forget they are part of the chosen people of God.

During his introduction he turned his thoughts to artists saying that Wednesday 6 May he received a letter from a group of them thanking him for his prayers:

"I would like to ask the Lord to bless them because through artists we understand beauty, and without beauty we cannot understand the Gospel," he said.

At the end of his General Audience on Wednesday on the theme of prayer, the Pope said, "It is artists who often interpret this silent groan which weighs on every creature and is expressed above all in the heart of men and women, for "A human being is a beggar before God."

All around the world, classrooms have closed and homes have become places of learning. As a result, we have had to find new ways to safely reach the hungry children who rely on Mary's Meals.

Our food is already being distributed in villages in Kenya for parents to collect and take home to their children and this approach will soon be mirrored in Malawi and Zambia, while ensuring we continue to adhere to public health policy.

New ways of feeding have also been agreed for India and Haiti, and we are having urgent discussions with governments and community leaders in the other countries where we work to ensure we can safely reach hungry children in these extraordinarily difficult circumstances.

Maria Igoe writes:

'Paul Henderson.

You may have noticed that we have been praying for Paul for several weeks now. He caught the corona virus in early March and developed a severe cough. This resulted in the perforation of an abdominal operation he had previously had, which caused many complications. He had double pneumonia, pleurisy, and the fluid he had in his lungs was difficult to drain. In the Western General Hospital he was in Intensive Care for 40 days. He received one-to-one nursing and had 8 blood transfusions and kidney dialysis. He then had a tracheostomy and was then able to breathe without a ventilator. When he became conscious he was unable to walk but he was very happy to have survived.

He no longer has the virus and is gaining strength slowly. He still has his sense of humour.

All over Scotland many people were praying for Paul. Large Prayer Groups prayed daily for him, as well as several Parishes and individuals. Paul will be 55 this month. He went to St Thomas High School. His brother, Robert (Rab) attended Holy Rood and lives in our Parish. He is older. He may be remembered, as he was a very good footballer. Through WhatsApp Robert kept us informed about Paul's condition and this encouraged people in their prayers. It was a stressful time but Paul has a strong spirit and is planning climbing his next "Munro". Thank you to everyone who prayed for him. He is still in WGH but with your prayers will continue to improve.

Feeding the homeless at this difficult time.

The Missionaries of Charity (founded by St Teresa of Calcutta), are continuing to feed the homeless, supplying them with take-away meals. They operate from Hopetoun Cres and are giving meals to 80-90 people daily. Helpers, Angela and Rita, go in the morning to peel lots of vegetables. The Sisters are then able to cook whatever meat they have, mince, burgers etc and provide a nourishing meal. They also supply a carton of juice or bottle of water and a small snack.

It is good to know that the Sisters are able to continue their outreach to the homeless.

Our parishioner, Derek, is involved, as he delivers food to Hopetoun Cres. It is great that some things are going on as normal!'
