

SCIAF - Covid Emergency Appeal



'The Covid crisis falls into that awkward category of emergencies, like many food crises, which build up slowly and where there is no single catastrophic event that triggers an appeal. Also, rather than being an emergency in another, developing country, this one affects us at home too. Indeed, the vast majority of cases are in Europe and the United States, and it is not clear yet whether the virus will affect tropical countries as much as those with temperate climates like our own.

This doesn't mean we shouldn't be responding with partners already. We are but we are concentrating on public health preventative measure, and food and livelihoods assistance. These will help prevent and restrict the pandemic, and enable people to be able to feed and provide for their families and loved ones during the restrictions that have been imposed in their countries.

What is does mean, however, is that there are relatively few cases in the developing world at the moment while people at home are having to cope with the acute peak of the crisis. Within this people are, very naturally, more focused on the health, safety and wellbeing of their families and friends and there is very little bandwidth in the media to cover the response to the pandemic in the developing news. With little evidence of acute need overseas, little media attention or scope for it, and people preoccupied with the situation here at home, it is our judgement that now is not the right time for a full emergency appeal.

Pentecost Sunday – 9am to 9pm - UK Rosary Relay Rally across Scotland, Wales, England

Antonia Moffatt writes: 'All the Scottish Bishops have given their blessing for this Pentecost Rosary relay Rally. The allocated hour for the Diocese of St Andrews and Edinburgh is 1pm.

Let there rise up across the UK and beyond a great ROAR in prayer before the Throne of God for conversion, help, Pope Francis has been encouraging Catholics to pray the Rosary in their family homes during the month of May, especially when the Pandemic is making us aware of the value of our families and making it possible for us to pray together in lockdown at home. He encourages simple Rosaries and joining online Rosary initiatives to pray to Our Lady for deliverance from Covid-19 and he has composed two prayers for this intention. This is to be led in the form of a Rosary relay Rally where the Dioceses designated in their Rosary Hour encourage the peoples across their Diocese to pray the Rosary either, individually, in families, as online prayer groups, parish groups, and where possible led online by their parish priests and Bishop.

It does not matter what time during the specified hour that the Rosary is prayed.

Then on the hour the next Dioceses take up the Rosary relay Rally and so on until 9pm. At 9pm the Rosary Rally will end with a Rosary being led by Bishop John Keenan from St. Mirin's Cathedral in Paisley which you can access online via Bishop John Keenan facebook page.

hygiene safeguards.

PHASE 2

Marriages and other types of ceremonies to take place with minimal number of attendees.

> (CHURCHES TO RE-OPEN)

PHASE 3

Places of worship open to extended groups subject to physical distancing/hygiene safeguards.

Relaxation of restrictions to attend funerals and marriages beyond close family. Mass gatherings resume in line with public health

advice.

PHASE 4

All ceremonies can take place, with improved hygiene and other precautions.
