Wonderful News of the Release of Mohammad el Sharif – update, 1 May 2025

Jane Salmonsen, St John's parishioner and chief executive of Firefly (an Edinburgh based international charity that supports children affected by war in Bosnia, Gaza, and among Syrian refugees, partnering with local experts), writes: 'Last Tuesday I learned that my friend and former Firefly colleague, a specialist in child trauma, Mohammad el Sharif, had been released from detention and is back with his family in Gaza. This is wonderful news.

Mohammad was one of ten Palestinian medics all released together that day.
